Newborn surrendered inside Safe Haven Baby Box

Recently, a healthy newborn baby girl was safely surrendered, at Franciscan Health Hospital in Hammond, Indiana, via a Safe Haven Baby Box that had been active for less than 30 days. This is the third newborn placed in a Safe Haven Baby Box in less than two years in Indiana. This is also the seventh surrendered infant in Indiana for 2019.

Franciscan Hospital Emergency Department and security were notified by the alarm as soon as the newborn's mother opened the outside door to place her baby in the box. Within 90 seconds, the newborn baby was retrieved from the box and received medical care. The hospital staff worked flawlessly as they followed every hospital and Safe Haven Baby Boxes protocol established for receiving a newborn baby birthed outside a hospital.

"I want to personally thank the brave mother that carried her child to term, kept her safe, and then exercised her rights under the safe haven law and surrendered her newborn in our box. She is healthy and perfect.", said Monica Kelsey, founder and CEO of Safe Haven Baby Boxes.

"This brave young mom is exactly why I fight so hard to give moms more options. She contacted us within a few days of the surrender and we are providing her resources available in her area to give her the support she needs. She did not call the hotline before placing the newborn in the box, and she is not from the Hammond area," Kelsey added.

First Safe Haven Baby Box in Lake County receives blessing, first surrender at Franciscan Health Hammond

Four months after dedicating the first Safe Haven Baby Box at a hospital in Indiana, Franciscan Health recently celebrated the installation of a baby box at its second hos-

The baby box recently received its first newborn less that 30 days after the box became operational (see related story).

The recent formal blessing at Franciscan Health Hammond also marked the first Safe Haven Baby Box in Lake County. Like the one at Franciscan Health Michigan City, the baby box in Hammond is aimed at preventing the death of an unwanted infant.

The box is available to new mothers who wish to utilize Indiana's Safe Haven Law, which enables a per-

son to give up an unwanted infant anonymously without fear of arrest or prosecution. The anonymity of the Safe Haven Baby Box is a last resort for women in crisis and displays our Franciscan value of respect for life.

Monica Kelsey, founder and CEO of Safe Haven Baby Box, hailed the success of the effort, saying, "So far in Indiana in just 2019, we have had six safe surrenders in our state and zero dead babies. That's what it is all about."

Kelsey thanked LaHayne Funeral Home in Hammond, which donated the cost of the baby box, along with Knights of Columbus, which has raised money to support her organization. Franciscan Health Hammond President-CEO Patrick Maloney also

thanked the hospital's facilities staff, which set up the discreet location outside the Women's Specialty Center and Renal Dialysis Center Entrance at the hospital, 5454 Hohman Avenue.

When the box is used, a silent alarm will sound so that staff can immediately tend to the baby.

Indiana K-9 program graduates seven out-of-state teams after nine weeks of rigorous training

A ceremony held recently recognized the graduation of seven K-9 teams from the DNR Division of Law Enforcement's K-9 Resource Protection Program. The seven graduating teams represented the states of Kansas, Oregon, Utah, and Virginia.

The K-9 teams trained and honed their skills in Orange County in southern Indiana to qualify.

"The officers and their

K-9 partners graduating have completed nine total weeks of rigorous training," said Maj. Tim Beaver of DNR Law Enforcement. "That is a tremendous personal investment and a lot of time spent away from home. The first time you locate that lost child or that trespassing poacher, it will all be worth it."

The Indiana K-9 program started in 1997, with a pilot program of two teams. The

effectiveness of the program was quickly realized. The program grew to a team of 12 K-9 units located throughout Indiana. There is at least one K-9 unit in all 10 Indiana DNR Law Enforcement dis-

The Indiana K-9 program is not only well-respected in the Hoosier state, but also recognized as one of the top programs in the nation. Indiana has helped start and

train teams from seven sister natural resource agencies (Idaho, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Oregon, Utah, and Virginia).

Indiana K-9 teams are trained in man-tracking, wildlife detection, and article searches. All canines are trained to locate white-tailed deer, wild turkey, waterfowl and ginseng. They may also be trained to locate other spe-(See **K-9** Pg. 8)



Purdue Northwest professor among wi ning team of scientists studying the origin of tl

Finding the origin of the universe through the tiniest of particles has been the life quest of Purdue University Northwest Professor of Physics Neeti Parashar. She was recently honored among more than 400 scientific researchers with the 2019 High Energy and Particle Physics Prize awarded by the European Physical Society.

EPS recognized the work of two research collaborations, CDF and D0 (D-ZERO), "for the discovery of the top quark and the detailed measurement of its properties" in Ghent, Belgium. Parashar is a research scientist on the D0 collaboration.

Teaching Chemistry and Physics all of its properties, like Department at PNW's College of Engineering and Sciences, Parashar was instrumental in securing full and contributing membership of the D0 collaboration in 2006. The team is based at the Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory located in Batavia, Illinois, which houses the particle collider accelerator used in the research.

"To discover and subsequently make detailed studies of these fundamental particles, you need the right operating conditions of the accelerator," said Parashar. "While the top quark was discovered in 1995, the Research, known as CERN.

the challenge has been to study mass, width, electroweak couplings, production cross sections, and decay branching ratios."

Understanding properties accurately will help researchers explore unique information on fundamental interactions at the electroweak breaking scale and beyond.

Subatomic research at PNW isn't limited to only faculty. Parashar regularly takes her team of undergraduate students to Fermilab and to Geneva, Switzerland, to conduct experiments at the European Organization for Nuclear


"We at PNW are on the global map of scientific discoveries," said Parashar. "Purdue Northwest the only institution in Northwest Indiana with full membership to these worldrenowned research labs, and the recipient of peer-reviewed, merit-based federal funding from the National Science Foundation to conduct this research."

Seven years Parashar, who founded and heads PNW's high-energy physics program at PNW, was also among those on the research team that discovered the Higgs boson, dubbed 'The God Particle'. The 2013 Nobel Prize in



The newborn has been released from the hospital and in custody of the Department of Child Services to start the standard safe haven surrender process for finding her a forever family. The Department of Child Services is working diligently to have this child with her adoptive family within 30 days. If you would like to adopt this little girl, contact your local Department of Social Services and register as a foster/adoption family. There are thousands of kids in foster care looking for forever families.

Franciscan Health Hospital currently has Safe Haven Baby Boxes available in Hammond and Michigan City, Indiana. There are currently 14 active Safe Haven Baby Boxes in Indiana and Ohio and several more planned to go live by the end of 2019.

Safe Haven Baby Boxes staffs a 24-hour National hotline at 1-866-99BABY1 that gives women in crisis the opportunity to reach out for help and get the information they need to make a lifesaving choice for their baby. This option helps prevent parents from making a decision that would haunt them for the rest of their lives. Safe Haven Laws are simply words on paper for those who need to utilize this law, but do not know it exists. Education and help in the midst of crisis are vital steps needed with the implementation of the Safe Haven Laws in this country.





To qualify for the scholarship, students had to either graduate in the highest 20% of their high school class or earn a score in the top 20th percentile on the SAT or ACT. To continue earning the scholarship in college, students must earn a 3.0 cumulative GPA and complete at least 30 credit hours per year.

This day in history

September 20, 1963

On this day in 1963, President John F. Kennedy suggested that the Soviet Union and the United States cooperate on a mission to jointly send men to the moon. The proposal caught both the Soviets and many Americans off guard.

Since 1957, when the Soviets sent a small Sputnik satellite into orbit, Russian and American scientists had been competing to see who could make the next breakthrough in space travel. In 1961, Kennedy proclaimed that he was determined to win the "space race" with the Soviets.

Kennedy upped the ante that year when he stated that the United States would put a man on the moon before the end of the decade. In 1963, relations between the United States and Soviet Union had improved. The Cuban Missile Crisis of 1962 had been settled peacefully; a "hot line" had been established between Washington and Moscow to help avert conflict; and a treaty banning the open air testing of nuclear weapons had been signed.

What might have come of Kennedy's idea is unknown; two months later he was assassinated in Texas. His successor, Lyndon B. Johnson, abandoned the idea of cooperating with the Soviets but pushed ahead with the U.S. lunar program. In 1969, Kennedy's foresight was fulfilled, as the United States successfully landed men on the moon.
