Active-shooter drill a lesson for nursing and EMS students

For a third year, an active shooter simulation drill involving University of Saint Francis-Crown Point nursing students, Franciscan Health-Crown Point emergency medical technician and paramedic students, and numerous area fire departments and ambulance services took place recently at the university.

In the scenario, at least four students were 'killed' and 16 'injured' when the deranged gunman, portrayed by Rob Dowling, director of the emergency medical service for Franciscan Alliance, entered the building. He took out his first 'victim', who survived a chest wound, then proceeded down hallways and into classrooms where he 'shot' students before leaving the building and being apprehended by police.

Nursing students assessed 'injuries' and provided aid until emergency medical services personnel arrived to further assess and transport the

Family vacati IS Still a popul ar priority for n ions of Americans, according to motor club

Now is the time when millions of families across the country are starting to plan getaways for summer vacation and long holiday weekends throughout the year. According to a recent AAA survey, more than one-third of Americans (35%) are planning to take a vacation of 50 miles or more away from home involving two or more

immediate family members in 2017. The overall volume of travelers remains unchanged from last year, indicating that Americans continue to prioritize traveling as a family.

While most families (70%) are planning to take one or two vacations, there is a significant increase this year in the number of Americans

who say they are planning to take three or more vacations. The 28% of Americans who will take three or more family vacations this year is 13% higher than in 2016.

"Families continue to see the value of traveling as a way to bond and reconnect in today's busy world," said Bill Sutherland, AAA senior vice president of Travel and

Publishing. "The best way to wrap up a family vacation is to start planning the next one, as more and more Americans are starting to do."

The old school family road trip (79%) and visits to national parks (51%) and theme parks (40%) remain the most popular types of vacations for families planning to travel this year. Trips to international destinations (33%), going on guided or escorted tours (22%) and ocean cruises (20%) are also popular with family travelers.

Those planning to pack up their cars for a road trip in 2017 will be in good company. Compared to 2016, 10% more families are expected to take road trips this year, despite average gas prices that

are 47¢ higher than they were this time last year.

The number of American families planning to take a guided or escorted tour is expected to increase 7% over 2016.

"While many Americans enjoy the flexibility of a road trip, there are some families who prefer the structure and (See Vacations Pg. 2)





This day in history

APRIL 21, 1980

Rosie Ruiz, age 26, finished first in the women's division of the Boston Marathon with a time of 2:31:56. She was rewarded with a medal, a laurel wreath and a silver bowl. However, eight days later Ruiz was stripped of her victory after race officials learned she jumped into the ace about a mile before the finish line.

Ruiz, an administrative assistant from New York City, qualified for the 84th Boston Marathon by submitting her time for running the 1979 New York City Marathon. It's believed that Ruiz intended to jump into the middle of the pack of runners but miscalculated when she joined the marathon one mile from the end, not realizing she was ahead of the other 448 female competitors.

Ruiz was unknown in the running world and her victory raised suspicions because it was a 25-minute improvement over her New York City Marathon time. Additionally, her winning time was then the third-fastest marathon time in history for a woman. After studying race photographs - Ruiz didn't appear in any of them until the very end - and conducting interviews, Boston Marathon officials stripped Ruiz of her title. Ruiz's New York time was later invalidated when officials discovered she had taken the subway during part of the race.
