## **Crown Point resident breaks Indiana** state lake record with whitefish catch

Friday the 13th proved lucky for a Crown Point angler who broke the record for biggest lake whitefish caught in Indiana.

Dustin Meeter landed his 6-pound, 3-ounce lake whitefish on Lake Michigan near Burns Harbor in Portage. The fish measured 25.5 inches long. Meeter's fish marks the sixth record lake whitefish since the state established a category for the species in 2012. It bested the previous record, caught by Alexander Ciesielski in 2017, by nearly a half-pound.

Meeter caught the whitefish from a boat while fishing with two other friends. Earlier in the day, the friends had trolled for coho salmon and caught their daily limit. They then headed toward shore to jig for lake trout.

"Within a minute, I caught that whitefish," Meeter said.



"It was the best day of fishing I've ever had."

Last year, Meeter caught the first whitefish of his life in the same spot under similar circumstances. Unfamiliar with whitefish and unaware of the state record, Meeter simply took the large fish home. He didn't bother to look up the record until a friend suggested he do so. But he had already fileted the fish.

Meeter thinks that 2017 fish also may have been a record breaker.

Nonetheless, "It was great eating," Meeter said.

Meeter submitted his most recent whitefish to DNR staff for official weighing the Monday after he caught it. He said he plans to have the fish mounted for display.

Whitefish have long been targets of commercial fishing operations in northern Lake Michigan due to demand for their flaky white flesh. Recently, sport anglers

## Purdue Northwest offers free cybersecurity camp to high school teachers, students

Purdue University Northwest's College of Technology will offer free cybersecurity summer camps for high school teachers and students from northwest Indiana, southwest Michigan and the Chicago metropolitan area through a \$194,010 grant, jointly funded by the National Security Agency (NSA) and the National Science Foundation (NSF). This is the third consecutive year PNW has received the grant for the summer programs.

# Grants available for field trips to state parks, lakes available to schools

Educators interested in taking students, grades K-12, on field trips to an Indiana state park or state-managed lake in the 2018-2019 school year can receive financial help through the Indiana Natural Resources Foundation.

Grants from the Discover the Outdoors Fund are available for public, private, parochial or home-school educators, according to INRF director Jody Kress.

"Part of our mission at the Indiana Natural Resources Foundation is to encourage educational programs of DNR," Kress said. "The grant gets kids outside for an adventure that teaches the importance of preserving and protecting our natural resources."

Since the grant program's inception in 2013, a total of 111 grants have been award-

ed, providing the opportunity for more than 8,000 students to visit state parks at less cost to the schools and students.

Indiana has 24 state parks and eight state-managed lakes eligible for field trip funding that will engage students in learning about Indiana's fish, forest, wildlife, natural habitats and conservation.

"These trips help children understand how previous generations viewed the significance of Indiana's natural and cultural resources, and at the same time let them make great memories that they will carry into adulthood," said Ginger Murphy, deputy director for stewardship for DNR State Parks

The maximum grant award is \$250 per application.

Applications are accepted from through June 30 prior to

the school year for which the grant is requested. Applications must be postmarked no later than June 30. Applicants will be notified by August 15 regarding potential grant awards.

The challenge encourages visitors to walk, run, bike, paddle, or swim at least 25 miles inside one or more of Indiana's state park properties. If you're a horseback rider, you can participate by riding at least 100 miles on state park or reservoir horse

Those who complete the challenge by November 30 will be entered into a drawing for prizes, including a 2019 Annual Entrance Pass, Outdoor Indiana magazine subscriptions, DNR camping gift cards, and State Park Inns gift certificates.

Participants must download and keep a Fitness Challenge log that documents their visits to state parks and get a signature from park staff each time they visit.

Indiana State Parks director Dan Bortner said state parks offer hundreds of miles of trails that wind past lakes, climb big hills, wander through deep forests and canyons, and explore prairies. Many locations also offer accessible hard-surface trails.

"All of these pathways offer opportunities for exercise," Bortner said. "They also offer the added benefit of just being outdoors, where it is possible to shed the worries and challenges of daily life for a little while."

## This day in history

#### May 18, 2004

Arizona Diamondbacks Forty-year-old lefthander Randy Johnson became the oldest pitcher in major league history to throw a perfect game, leading his team to a 2-0 victory over the Atlanta Braves. A "perfect game" is when a pitcher faces a minimum 27 batters, recording 27 outs. Through the 2006 season, only 17 perfect games had been thrown, including 15 in the 'modern era' (post-1900).

Johnson, known for his overpowering fastball, intimidating size, and equally fearsome mullet, struck out 13 batters in the game. He led the National League in strikeouts for the fifth time that year; he had previously won four strikeout titles in the American League, even though managers routinely stacked their lineups with right-handed hitters to combat Johnson's utter dominance of left-handers. The 6-foot-10inch "Big Unit" used his height and length to full advantage, striding towards the plate and throwing the ball sidearm, so that left-handers could not see the pitch until it was on top of them or past them.

In 1995, with the Seattle Mariners, he won his first of five Cy Young Awards, given each year to the best American League and National League pitchers. His next four Cy Youngs came consecutively from 1999 to 2002, while he pitched for the National League's Arizona Diamondbacks.






