IDEM grants available for community recycling projects

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management announced Monday the availability of grant funding for recycling and household hazardous waste collection and disposal from the agency's Community Recycling Grant Program.

"IDEM is happy to offer grants to communities and organizations that are working to increase recycling efforts throughout Indiana," said IDEM Commissioner Bruno Pigott. "These grants will fund projects that educate Hoosiers and promote recycling, which will go a long way in helping to protect our state's environment."

Counties, municipalities, solid waste management districts, schools, and nonprofit organizations in Indiana are eligible to submit a Community Recycling Grant application requesting \$500 to \$100,000 in funding.

Applications will be accepted through March 1, 2021.

The Community Recycling Grant Program is funded through IDEM's Solid Waste Management Fund. Eligible projects should focus on education and promotion of recycling, processing of recyclable materials, waste reduction, and HHW and organics management (including yard waste management and composting).

Grant funding is intended to create successful, cost-effective programs. Applicants must demonstrate a positive environmental impact within the project service area, an increase in waste diversion as a result of the project, and show the sustainability of the project.

Final funding determinations will be made at the end of March 2021.





This week in history

March 1, 1781

The Articles of Confederation were ratified. The Articles were signed by Congress and sent to the individual states in 1777 after 16 months of debate. Bickering over land claims delayed the final ratification for four more years. Maryland finally approved on March 1, 1781, affirming the Articles as the outline of the official government of the United States.

The nation was guided by the Articles until the implementation of the current U.S. Constitution in 1789. The predominance of the states under the Articles is explicit by the claims of Article II, which reads, "Each state retains its sovereignty, freedom, and independence, and every power, jurisdiction, and right, which is not by this Confederation expressly delegated to the United States, in Congress assembled."

Less than five years after the ratification of the Articles of Confederation, enough leading Americans decided that the system was inadequate to the task of governance and they peacefully overthrew their second government in just over 20 years.

The difference between a collection of sovereign states forming a confederation and a federal government created by a sovereign people lay at the heart of debate as the new American people decided what form their government would take.







Veterans can now deduct more for military retirement funds

Military retirees and surviving spouses may experience a larger tax deduction from their military retirement funds this individual income tax season due to a 2019 Indiana tax law, advises the Indiana Department of Revenue.

Gov. Eric Holcomb signed House Enrolled Act (HEA) 1010 in the summer of 2019 to allow eligible taxpayers to deduct up to \$6,250 plus an additional 50% of their military retirement income

or survivor's benefits for the 2020 tax year. This is an increase of 25% since 2019 and the deducible amount will continue to increase by 25% each year until 2022 when 100% of the amount received will be eligible for the deduction.


To claim the Military Retirement Income or Survivor's Benefits Deduction, use Schedule 2 (or Schedule C if filing Form IT-40PNR) from the Indiana individual income tax return.

Information on calculating the amount to deduct is available in tax instruction booklets, which are available online.

Hoosiers have saved an average of \$282 per month since the start of the pandemic

There is no doubt about the unprecedented disruption caused by the pandemic, or the great financial struggle many Americans across the nation are experiencing. However, what might seem counterintuitive given the current state of the economy, the Consumer Credit report found that credit card debt in the US has plummeted since the start of the pandemic. Are Americans proactively attempting to pandemic-proof their finances during this period of economic uncertainty?

Financial support and lender, CreditNinja, conducted a survey of 3,000 adults (18+) to find out how their saving habits have changed during the pandemic due to economic uncertainty. This found that the average Hoosier (in full-time employment) has saved \$282 each month since the start of the pandemic (March 1, 2020) - this compares to a national average of \$329. Considering there have been fewer opportunities to leave the home due to social distancing, it is likely people are saving on costs such as gas, commuting and eating out.

Broken down across the US, it was found the average Alaskan saved the most since the start of the pandemic at \$655. Comparatively, Louisianans saved the least at \$150 each.

With people having to adjust to a different sense of normal during these unprecedented times, many have adapted their everyday habits in order to reduce the risk of contracting the virus. The survey found that over 1 in 5 (23%) say they are avoiding using cash these days due to the coronavirus risk.

The research also found that, with many economists unable to agree how long the recession will last, 86% of



respondents say they intend on continuing to save a portion of their available income through 2021 as a precaution. This could mean saving on small costs, such as cooking rather than ordering takeout, having your morning coffee at home instead of buying, walking to the grocery store

having a night in instead of a night out.

Due to many workers having lost their source of income during the pandemic and having to put a pause on monthly repayments, it is understandable why 22% of Hoosiers surveyed say they

to save on fuel, or simply are concerned their credit score will be affected during the pandemic. Having a poor credit score can lead to numerous future financial challenges, such as not being able to qualify for credit cards or bank loans.

Opening accounts with utility companies, such as water, internet and cable can also be trickier with a lower credit score and may require the payment of a deposit or letter of guarantee, in case you fall behind on payments.

Given the current state of the economy, CreditNinja's research revealed that 4 in 5 adults admit they are more

likely now to put available money away for a rainy day fund instead of spending it immediately. Lastly, the survey found that 86% of respondents with savings say they would be even more nervous about their personal finances if they had no rainyday fund to fall back on.
