Jerry Ross teacher nominated for 'Best Buddies' Champion of the Year

Best Buddies Indiana recently announced that local educator Jennifer Ciochina, of Crown Point, has been nominated for the Best Buddies Champion of the Year award.

Ciochina, a teacher at Jerry Ross Elementary School, was informed this summer of the honor, and it was made official at the Champion of the Year Kick-Off Celebration in Indianapolis, where 12 nominees from around the state were honored for their contributions and leadership within the Best Buddies Organization. The Best Buddies Champion of the Year will be named at the annual Gala event at the Indiana Roof Ballroom on November 9.

Champion of the Year Nominees are selected based on their individual, professional, and philanthropic achievements as well as their passion for the Best Buddies mission.

DeMotte native, chaplain in the U.S. Navy supports the nation's nuclear deterrence mission

Lt. Nathan Boon is a Navy chaplain serving with Strategic Communications Wing One, a versatile command capable of consisting of three Navy squadrons and a Wing staff that employs over 1,700 active-duty sailors and 100 contractors to provide maintenance, security, operations, administration, training, and logistic support for the E-6B Mercury aircraft fleet.

Boon is a 2005 graduate of Baptist Bible College and is responsible for providing a spectrum of support service to individual sailors and their families.

the Navy to many of the lessons learned growing up in DeMotte.

"I come from a farming town where I learned hard work and to never give up," said Boon.

The mission stems from the original 1961 Cold War order known as 'Take Charge and Move Out!' Adapted as TACAMO and now the command's nickname, today, the men and women of TACAMO continue to provide a survivable communication link between national decision makers and the nation's nuclear weapons.

The commander-in-chief Boon credits success in issues orders to members

of the military who operate nuclear weapons aboard submarines, aircraft or in land-based missile silos. Sailors aboard TACAMO E-6 Mercury aircraft provide the one-of-a-kind and mostsurvivable communication needed for this critical mission.

"It is a very supportive command that executes a very important strategic mission," said Boon.

The Navy's presence aboard an Air Force base in the middle of America may seem like an odd location given its distance from any ocean; however, the central location allows for

the deployment of aircraft to both coasts and the Gulf of Mexico on a moment's notice. This quick response is key to the success of the nuclear deterrence mission.

"I am proud to be a part of the 24/7 response force ready at all times to deter adversaries and threats," said Boon.

"The Navy is an opportunity to serve my country and my God at the same time," said Boon.

Healy plans on attending Indiana University, majoring in Elementary Education.





This day in history

October 18, 1931

Thomas Alva Edison, one of the most prolific inventors in history, died at 84 on this day in 1931. He developed serious hearing problems at an early age, and this disability provided the motivation for many of his inventions.

Edison's experiments were guided by his intuition, but he also took care to employ assistants who provided the mathematical and technical expertise he lacked. In 1877 he stumbled onto one of his great inventions, the phonograph, while working on a way to record telephone communication.

Although the discovery of a way to record and play back sound ensured him a place in history, it was just the first of several Edison creations that would transform late 19th-century life. Among other notable inventions, Edison and his assistants developed the first practical incandescent light bulb, and a forerunner of the movie camera and projector.

Perhaps his greatest contribution to the modern industrial world came from his work in electricity. Edison developed a complete electrical distribution system for light and power, set up the world's first power plant in New York City, and invented the alkaline battery, the first electric railroad, and other inventions that laid the basis for the modern electric world. He continued to work into his 80s and acquired 1,093 patents in his lifetime.





INDOT offers scholarships, jobs to engineers in training engineering scholarship

The Indiana Department of Transportation is offering civil engineering students scholarships of up to \$3,125 per semester, and paid employment during summer breaks and upon graduation.

Students must be accepted or enrolled full time in one of Indiana's certified civil engineering schools and apply using the form at www. INDOTScholarship.IN.gov. Applications for the 2020-21 school year must be submitted by Tuesday, December 31, 2019.

INDOT's scholarship program uses federal funds to offer \$3,125 per semester or \$2,083 per trimester for up to five years of post-secondary civil engineering education. Scholarship funds can be applied to educational expenses, fees and books. In return, recipients will work for INDOT in full-time, paid positions during their summer breaks and upon graduation.

Students must be accepted or enrolled full-time in one of Indiana's Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology certified civil engineering programs. Eligible programs include Purdue University Wayne, Purdue University, Rose-Hulman Institute

Technology, University, Purdue University Northwest, University of Evansville, University of Notre Dame, and Valparaiso University.
