Navy commissions littoral combat ship 'Indianapolis' during ceremony at Burns Harbor

Burns Harbor is known for producing steel and has a long, rich history of supporting U.S. defense capabilities.

"To the citizens of the great state of Indiana showing your support for the men and women of America's military and this fantastic new addition to the fleet," said Lisa W. Hershman, deputy chief management officer for the Department of Defense and the ceremony's principle speaker. "It is always a thrill to see a Navy ship commissioned, but it is truly a historic moment to do so on the shores of Lake Michigan."

The ceremony honored veterans of USS Indianapolis (CA 35), a cruiser which sunk in the final days of World War II after completing a secret mission to deliver components for an atomic bomb. Her crew spent several days in the water awaiting

As part of the ceremony, Dick Thelen, veteran seaman 2nd class and a survivor of that mission, handed the 'long glass' (telescope) to Lt. Julian Turner, navigator of the first watch.

The ship's motto, 'Legacy of War' reflects that ships named Indianapolis have served in World War I, World War II, and the Cold War. LCS 17 is the fourth ship to bear the name.

Jill Donnelly, the ship's sponsor, gave the first order, "Man our ship and bring her



to life!"

More than 8,000 people attended the commissioning ceremony including Indiana residents and friends and family of the crew.

Littoral combat ships are outfitted with mission packages that deploy manned and unmanned vehicles and sen-

sors in support of mine countermeasures, anti-submarine warfare, or surface warfare missions. The warship's modular mission packages can be quickly and cost effectively updated with new weapons and weapon systems without taking the ship out of service for modifica-

tions and modernizations.

LCS class ships allow the Navy to strengthen its partnership with other countries' navies and coast guards. LCS perform maritime security operations, theater security cooperation engagements, and freedom of navigation patrols - keeping critical

maritime commerce routes open. Littoral combat ships are able to patrol the littorals and access ports where other ships may be unable.

Indianapolis will be homeported in Naval Station Mayport in Florida.







December 6, 1969

In August 1969, the three-day Woodstock Music & Art Fair proved that 500,000 young people could gather peacefully in an environment of sex, drugs, and rock and roll. Four months later, the Altamont Festival was held in the northern California hills.

Altamont was the idea of the Rolling Stones, who hoped to cap off their U.S. tour with a concert that would be the West Coast equivalent of Woodstock in both scale and spirit.

The concert was to include Santana; Jefferson Airplane; Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young; and the Grateful Dead; along with the Stones. The event also included members the notorious Hells Angels motorcycle gang, allegedly acting as informal security staff in exchange for \$500 worth of beer - about \$3,500 in 2019 dollars.

The Grateful Dead left the venue early out of concern for their safety after Jefferson Airplane singer Marty Balin was knocked unconscious by one of the bikers.

During the Stones' set, Hell's Angel Alan Passaro stabbed 18-year-old Meredith Hunter to death just 20 feet in front of the stage. Hunter, an African-American man, was attending the concert with a white woman. Passaro was later acquitted.

The Altamont concert, along with the 1969 Manson Family murders, are generally acknowledged as the two events the media insisted portrayed as the end of the spirit of togetherness of the 1960s.


